COLUMBIAN STAR

1. **1475 Market Street**— The Historic Rhea County Courthouse built in 1891 and designated a National Historic Landmark in 1977. Still operated as a courthouse and also houses the Scopes Trial and Rhea Heritage Museums.



RUBY'S STAR

2. **1435 Market Street**— built in the early 1900's, this was the second location of the Robinson Drugstore. First a hospital then the office of Dr. Rogers occupied the upstairs. Currently home to The Gathering Place, an antique and gift store.



DOLLY MADISON STAR

3. **1440 Market Street**— built by the Morgan family in early 1900's. Dr. Harold Morgan had a dentist office upstairs and it once had Mansfield Diner and Phillips Jewelry downstairs. Currently owned by BWS Properties offering retail and office spaces as well as apartments.



PREMIUM STAR

4. **1391 Market Street**— established as Johnson Hardware in 1890 by Asahel Johnson and continued in family ownership until 1988. Upper story housing was completed in 2007. Currently home to SBH Sports.



SHOOTING STAR

5. **380 Main Street**— built in 1927 and was Cumberland Presbyterian Church until 1977. Purchased in 1991 by Dayton Revival Center which holds a Sunday morning and evening service.



PINWHEEL STAR

6. **1325 Market Street**— opened in 1926 as Rogers and Pierce Pharmacy. The hospital operated by Dr. Walter Thomison & son was upstairs from 1930 until 1960. The pharmacy closed in April of 2004. Now home to Mudpies and Flutterbuys.



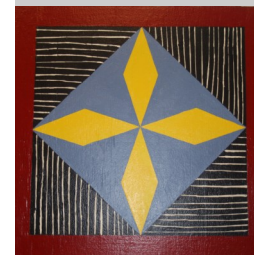
BRIGHT STAR

7. **1356 Market Street**— built in 1909. Originally Bailey Hardware, then Abel Hardware, and purchased by Mary Brooks in 1996. Reporters covering the Scopes Trial stayed upstairs. Currently home to ArtCrafters.



SPINNING STAR

8. **240 First Ave.**— built in 1887 with handmade bricks. Became known as the First Avenue Methodist Episcopal Church. Currently home to Trinity Community Center, an interdenominational organization that



supports area ministries.



RIBBON STAR

9. **107 Main Street**— home of the Rhea County Welcome Center built in 2000 and houses the offices of the Rhea Economic & Tourism Council, Dayton Chamber of Commerce, and Main Street Dayton.
